North Division Summary Ray Maitland

The level of play in the men's North Division continues to rise. Jesuit and Plano finished league play #1 and #2, respectively, with Jesuit realizing 2 consecutive years of undefeated play. Highland Park and St Marks made it to the regional playoffs once again. Coppell and Greenhill had solid seasons with obvious increases in skilled players. Most teams in the Division began the regeneration process due to the loss of seniors from the prior year, so the future looks promising for these teams.

The Division expanded and now has eight men's JV teams. This expansion was driven by the infusion of players from a strong Junior program, comprised this year of 250 boys in grades 5 through 8.

The North Division's women's league strengthened its 5 teams. These combined with 2 newly created Austin teams (Bowie and Austin H.S.) to form an expanded league with the necessary number of teams to match an existing southern league. The result is, for the first time in Texas lacrosse history, Women's Texas high school all-star and championship games are being held May 9th in Coppell, Texas.

The State women's league could not have been possible if it were not for the contribution of many people to the organization of new teams, supported by instructional clinics. Central Division Summary Bruce Clark

Lacrosse continued to elevate in Austin and San Antonio this year. Once again, the coaches and players in the division set a high standard for the quality of play for all division teams.

The division was led by St. Mary's Hall with its second undefeated season in conference play. St. Mary's Hall displayed a strong, balanced team in all positions. Tyler Turlington, sophomore midfielder, led the offense; he will return balanced team in all positions. Tyler Turlingon, sophomore midfielder, led the offense; he will return as a member of the North Allstar Team. Anchoring St. Mary's defense is junior defenseman, Greg Bice, and senior goalie, Garrett Cox.

Equaling St. Mary's strength is Austin High. Austin finished the conference season with only one loss to St. Mary's Hall, a team it will meet again in the playoffs. Austin's first playoff win was against strong rival Westwood High with a final score of 16 - 6.

Westwood High, Central Catholic and Westlake High rounded out the strength of the division with records of 6-2, 5-3 and 4-4, respectively. This finish is indicative of the parity in the Central Division.

Rounding out the division standings, McNeil, McCallum, and Bowie all finished very close. All 3 teams are young and expected to continue to improve next year.

Special congratulations to Anderson High and its first year in the league. Although Anderson finished last in the division, the coaches from the Central Division were impressed with the athleticism and skill displayed by the starter program.

Congratulations to all the players, parents, coaches and volunteers who made this year possible!

South Division Summary Doug Surant

The 1998 season was an excellent one for the South Division. Preseason expectations were that two-time defending state champions Kinkaid and 1997 semifinalist St. John's would continue their dominance of the division. Several other teams were poised to make a run for the other two

divisional playoff spots.

Early season action in the annual Aggieland Classic saw participation by public schools Lamar, Bellaire, Kingwood, and Cy-Fair. Lamar took 3 wins on Saturday against McNeil, Berkner and Cy-Fair to reach the finals. The Redskins took a 5-0 half-time lead and went on to a 9-4 win and the tournament title.

Kingwood hosted their first Jamboree tournament in February in what is hoped to be an annual event. The tournament featured a round-robin type format designed to provide competitive and inter-divisional matchups between teams that have never or only rarely played each other. Austin High, Westwood, and Plano came from out of town to participate against the local teams. The Kingwood Jamboree was a first class, first year event!

In March, Lamar went to the Golden Gate Invitational in the San Francisco Bay area and stunned the California natives by taking home the title.

St. John's took their spring trip to the popular San Diego Lacrosse Festival and continued the excellent showing of Texas teams in California going 4-2-1.(And, yes, we know, Earl's SMH team also played great lacrosse in the San Diego event!)

Kindaid's spring trip took them east to Florida where they played several Orlando area teams with convincing wins. The only blemish on their trip was a loss to the defending Florida champs, 12-6.

In closing, congratulations to coach Rusty Genson in his last year at the helm of the Memorial High's Mustangs. Rusty will coach closer to home in Sugarland next year with new blood already identified to pick up the reins at Memorial.




