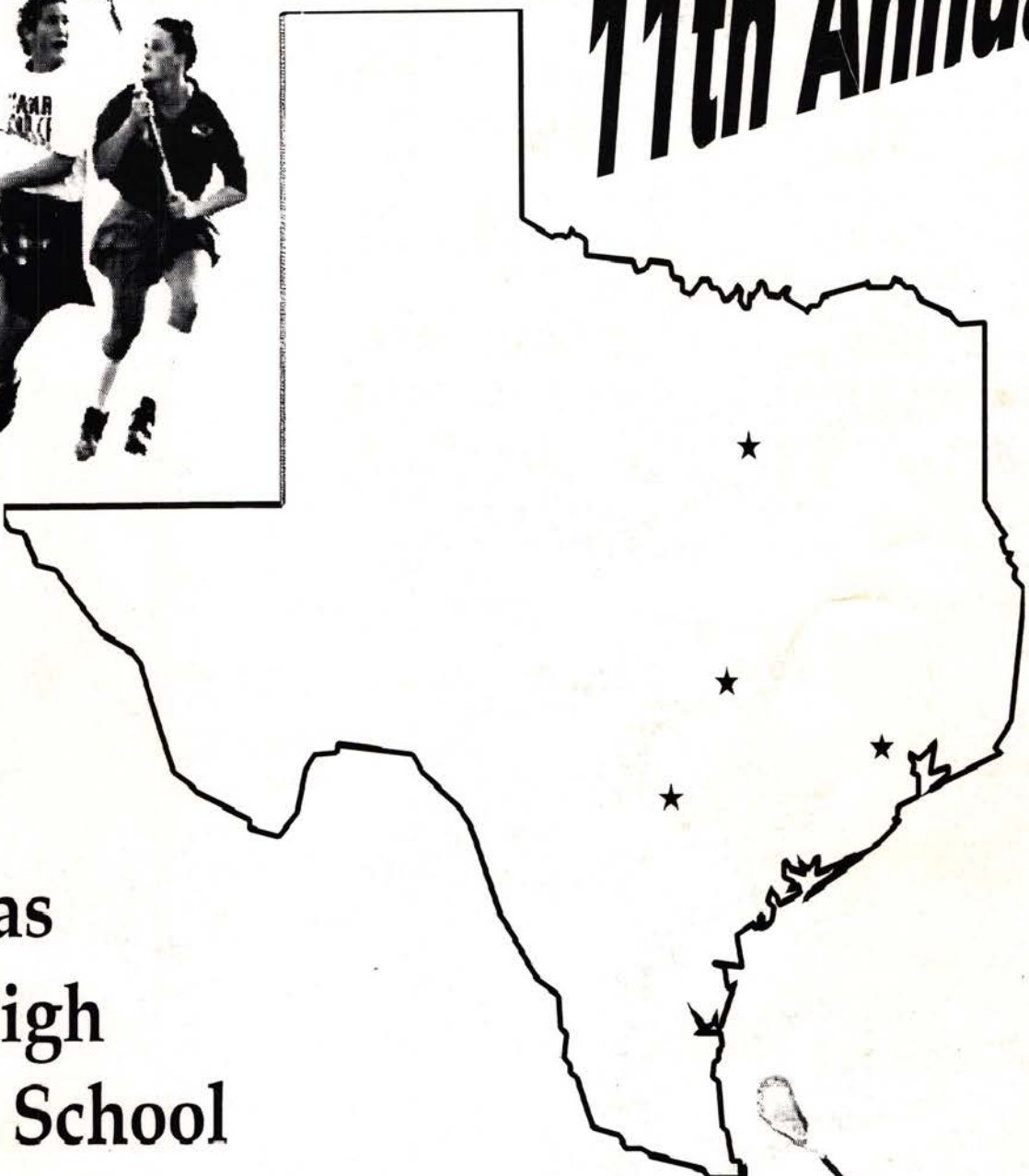


To Parents, Players, Coaches and Fans:

Our first season here in Austin got off to a slow start, but has certainly caught the attention of students, parents and fans alike. Our top two teams, Austin High and Bowie both formed teams last year for the 1997-1998 season and continued to lead the league in 1999. Our three newest teams Anderson, St. Andrew's, and Westlake had fantastic premier seasons, improving dramatically and giving Bowie and Austin High something to worry about next year. These teams boast some very talented players, and it is only a matter of time that experience and confidence will mold these teams into some of the best in the state. Austin High maintained a high level of play throughout the entire season remaining undefeated, while ending regular league play in a gut-wrenching tie with Bowie. Bowie finished in second place playing some great games on their good days. Anderson had an impressive first year; finishing in third place and making Bowie put forth an effort for their ranking. Fourth place St. Andrew's remains someone to watch in the future. Made up of only Freshmen and Eighth graders this year, these girls will only get better with time.

North Division Summary **Rose Banzahf**

The North District Girls season began with the addition of two new teams. The North Dallas Tornado and Episcopal School of Dallas teams have brought our number of teams in the North to seven. The season began just after the A&M tournament in February at which Plano took third place and Richardson came in fifth. Although the girls missed the opportunity to play the Austin teams since they have now separated into their own district, the new teams have added to the level of competition locally.

Traditionally strong Greenhill was challenged all year by a very healthy squad of girls from Plano. The Plano girls held first place down to the last week of play when Greenhill finally overcame a slim margin to end up the first place team going into the semi finals.

The North Dallas Tornado new kids on the block gave the league a wake-up call and bested three of the returning teams to sit in third place for the semifinals. The Coppell girls round out the play-off schedule.

At the end of the regular season Greenhill (6-0-0) sits in first place followed closely by

Plano(5-1-0) in second. North Dallas (3-3-0) is in third and Coppell (2-2-2) is in fourth. Fifth place goes to the Shreveport Loyola girls (1-4-1). Episcopal of Dallas (1-3-2) ranked number six for their first year. Richardson (0-5-1) closed out the league in seventh.

The Championship game on May 1 will determine who goes to Houston to represent the North at the State Tournament. The North All-stars have been named and are looking forward to playing in the All-star game in Houston.

Off season the North District girls participated in the Vail shootout with Team Texas, played in the Richardson Fall Tournament, attended a player clinic sponsored by the Shelton School of Dallas, played in the A&M tournament in February and the Loyola Tournament in March.

The North is making plans to start a seventh-eighth grade league next year. All the teams are excited to see the growth of girl's lacrosse in Texas and many of our graduating girls have made plans to attend colleges that offer them the opportunity to continue playing lacrosse.

South Division Summary

The 1999 season has been one of growth and excitement in the south zone. With nine girls high school lacrosse programs in the greater Houston area, there was never a dull moment. The level of competition has been improving every year, and this year was no exception. There were a record number of overtime games, with many matches being won by very slim margins. A strong Kingwood (7-1) squad finished the season ranked #1, followed by #2 Lamar (7-1), #3 Kinkaid (6-2), #4 St. John's (5-3), #5 Episcopal (4-4), #6 Memorial (4-4), #7 Woodlands (2-6), #8 Bellaire (1-7) and #9 Klein (0-8).

Our off season saw many girls involved in camps and a Team Texas trip to the Vail Shootout. Some coaches took part in referee clinics in an effort to raise the standard of play in Houston. All in all, girls' lacrosse is alive and well in Houston, and the future looks great!

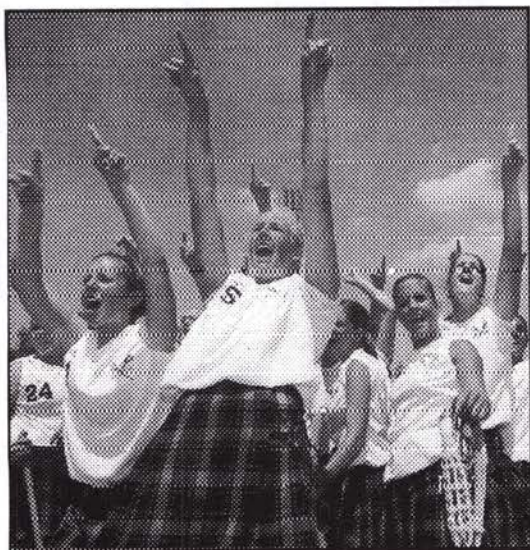

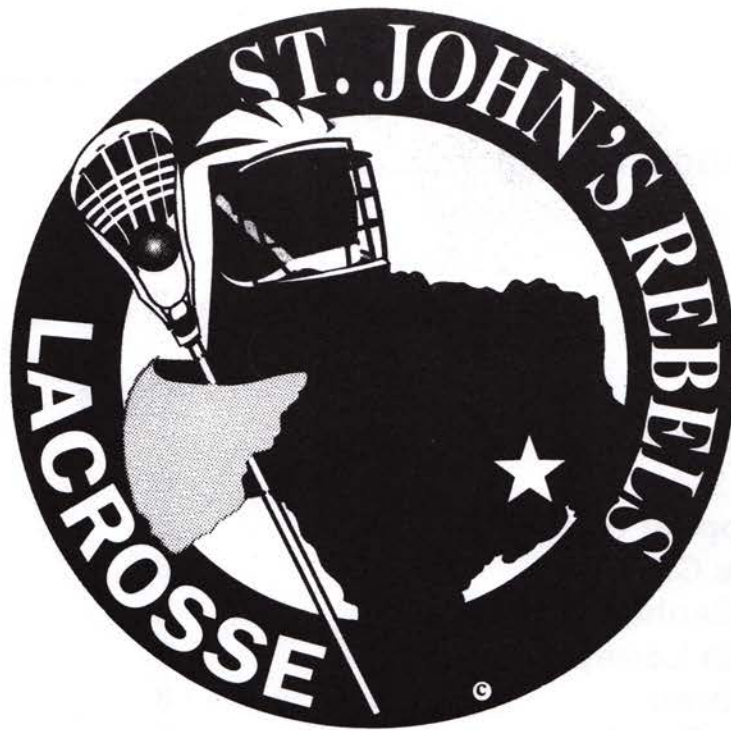

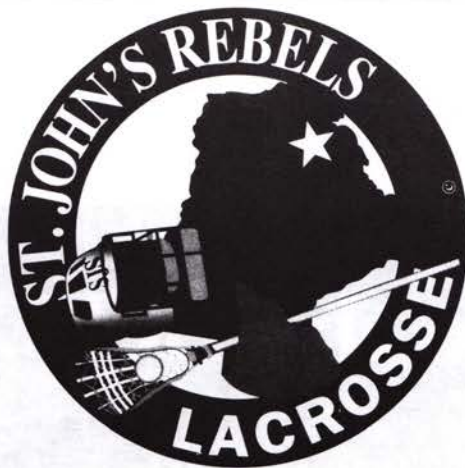
