## 2007 NORTH DISTRICT DIVISION I SEASON SUMMARY

***In a year that featured strong overall district goal-tending, North District - DI teams posted a successful 73% win percentage versus other Texas Districts and a 74 % against St. Mark's-State competition.***

St. Mark's (13-1), Highland Park (10-3) and ESD (10-3), Dallas Jesuit (15-3) and Southlake Carroll (9-9) finished in Lax Power's Texas Top 10 Regular Season Rankings. As impressive, all seven District teams were listed 1-7 in Lax Power's Strength of Schedule for the state of Texas. The North District Seeds are the following:

**Highland Park (2007: 10-3) (2006: 10-5):** A football injury to Denver-bound attackman Ryan Fanning (2006 All-State - 21G, 7A), as well as a recurring knee injury to senior midfielder Casey Glad hindered Highland Park's early season. Despite dropping two of their first three games, Coach Derek Thomson's Scots displayed steady improvement. In the final district game, Goalie Ian Reid led an inspired defense to a hard fought 8-7 squeaker over St. Mark's and the District's #1 Tournament Seed.

The season began with a road loss to Houston Kincaid (7-10), but was followed by inter-district wins over Austin High (10-4) and The Woodlands (10-6). Displaying a new offensive system, confidence was gained in mid-season, including inter-state wins over Tennessee's Montgomery Bell Academy (10-9), Memphis Christian Brothers (10-5) and Marietta, Georgia's, Pope High School (16-3).

Team strengths include depth, speed, and goals scored (10.8/ game). University of Denver-bound William Lawson (15G, 5A) and sophomores Austin Mai and Steven Bailey now comprise the speedy first line. All-State Face-off man Crispy Hoover and middle Johnny McKnight (13G, 8A) have recently ignited second line goal production. Attackmen Travis Gallivan (14G, 8A), Cole Smith (22G, 13A) and Joseph Scaling round out a well-balanced offensive group.

Defensively, the Scots are strong. Brett Martin (20 GB), Matt Cline (LSM, 37GB), and Jack Murtha (25GB) have improved in the second half of the season. While clearing the ball has sometimes been an "adventure", the D has given up a stingy 5.8 goals per game vs. the State's second most difficult schedule.

**St. Mark's (2007: 14-2; 2006: 15-2):** Underrated by the preseason pundits, St. Mark's sprinted through the 2007 season schedule with an almost +9 per game goal differential, secured their fourth consecutive SPC Title, and was Rated #1 in Texas in LaxPower's Season Ending Rankings.

One goal losses to Montgomery Bell Academy and Highland Park blemished an otherwise second consecutive perfect regular season. Inter-district successes included a victory over South representative St. John's (8-7) and convincing wins over Austin High (12-5) and SPC rival, St. Mary's Hall (11-0).

Offensively, the Lions' open motion offense (12.6 goals/game) reached double digits in ten of fourteen games. Unselfish, talented All-State and All-District offensive players spark Coach Lee's offense. Balanced scoring comes from the quick sticks of All-State attackman Spencer Branch (39G, 16A) and Jeff Perkins plus midfielders George Lauinger (31G, 9A) and James Blair (31G, 12A). Lauinger may be the state's best player.

Goalie Hollis Meyer leads the District's tightest defense (4.7 goals per game). All-State Defenseman Heath Townsend is well supported well by long stick defenders Arthur Brouseau, Zach Streit and Hawkins Golden. Normally noted for offense, the Lions have allowed only one opponent to reach double digits this year.

**Episcopal School of Dallas: (2007: 10-3) (2006 12-6):** One of the State's most successful programs, Coach Kevin Barnicle's Eagles again overcame injuries to compile a fine 10-3 overall record. The defensive-minded group suffered two losses to St. Mark's and an early season, overtime district loss to Dallas Jesuit (10-11).

Inter-district match-ups included convincing wins over St. John's (7-1) and Austin High (13-6). Inter-state home wins over highly regarded Montgomery Bell Academy (9-3) and Memphis Christian Brothers (8-6) propelled them to a 10 game winning streak.

Goal tending, face-offs, and defense are team strengths. Faceoff man, Seth Ratner, is being eyed by NCAA Division I programs and has a season average of 78 % face-offs won. Goalie Colt Power (211 Saves) and defensemen Cody Solaja (45 GB), Patrick Reese (37 GB), Thomas Luce (20 GB) and Jeff Redish (67 GB) lead a stalwart defense. Power's season-high 20 saves against HP were a key in the 6-4 district road victory.

The offensive unit, not as strong as 2006, remains quite capable. D.J. Sprenger has been hampered by a foot injury. However, talented Dartmouth recruit Rhett Miller (27G, 5A), midfielders Alex Hardt (30G, 14A),

Hahn Franklin-Mitchell (17G, 6A), and Will Bass (23G, 1A) continue to give opponents problems. Coach Barnicle believes his team must play "hungry" if they are to advance to the State Championship playoffs.

**Dallas Jesuit (2007: 15-3) (2006: 2-9):** Dallas Jesuit is the District's Cinderella story. Through improved off-season discipline and work ethic, Coach Chris Surran's Jesuit Rangers have transformed themselves from a 2-9 "tail-ender" to a 15-3 "contender" in just one year.

According to Coach Surran, "the biggest win" of the year was the early season effort vs. ESD 11-10, but Jesuit's "best game" was 11-5 victory over Montgomery Bell 11-5. Jesuit's-district wins vs. Houston Lamar (12-9) and St. Mary's Hall (3-1) plus Inter-State wins against Christian Brothers (15-9) and Pope High School (11-5) have emphasized the re-emergence of the Ranger's program.

Dallas Jesuit returned just six starters for the 2007 campaign. Attack Joe Boyle, "a finisher" (33G, 15A) and Midfielder Gunnar Rawlings (19G, 15A) initiate the offense. Luke Wade, who "displays great speed and toughness every game," has performed well at Face Off and is described as the "human clear".

Scott Crain's 62% save percentage in the cage anchors a defense that has given up only 6.2 goals per game. Untimely penalties have hurt the Rangers in big games. If they can solve that problem, Jesuit can advance in the playoffs.

**Southlake (9-9):** Competing in Division I for the third year and ranked 10th in the state, Coach David Smith's Dragons had an up and down year. The Dragon program continues to produce fine players but does not yet have great depth or consistency. Highly regarded All-District Middle Greg Lehane (16G, 8A) and All-State Defenseman Sam Stephenson will both go to play at Bryant University in NCAA Division II next year.

During their spring trip, Southlake split in four Inter-State games, losing to highly regarded St. Andrew's (Florida, 2-15) and nationally ranked McDonough (Baltimore, 4-17) but beat two Florida Schools, Gulliver Prep (7-6) and Pope John II (8-3). In their final two games of the year, Southlake improved in a one goal loss to Jesuit and stopping Plano (10-6).

In order to advance in the playoffs, the Dragons must take care of the ball in transition and let midfielders Lehane and Basil Kostaras (15G's, 16A's) shoot. Stephan Knipp (LSM, 46 GB's) and Eric Fleps (39 GB's, 29 TA's), both athletic and capable, must play up to expectations on the defensive side if Southlake is to engineer an upset.

**Plano (4-8):** Despite losing 12 seniors off the highly successful 2006 squad, Coach Kevin MacGibbon's Plano Wildcats exploded to a fast start by winning their first 3 games, beating Plano East 8-5, McCallum 8-2 and St. Anne's-Belfield (Virginia 2006 State Champions) 11-9. The key to the Wildcats' initial success was the attack trio of Juniors Alex McQuat (38G, 12A), James MacGibbon, and Sophomore Ross Gillum which scored 24 of 27 goals in these games.

During spring break, Gillum was sidelined with a leg injury against Cardinal Gibbons, and Plano dropped a tough, back and forth, loss, 9-7. The Cats returned to defeat Plano West and lead Highland Park by three goals into the final period, but injury to two attackmen and inexperience proved to be a difficult task for the young squad.

Since the HP game, Coach MacGibbon's squad has played without attackmen Gillum and MacGibbon. Although "shut off" or double teamed by remaining opponents, McQuat provided offensive spark with 17 goals in losses to Jesuit, ESH, Woodlands, ESD and St. Mark's.

Sophomores Matt Segler (8G in five games) and talented goalie Austin Black have impressed in the season's second half. For the Wildcats to advance, defensemen Sam Cook (60GB, 20TA) and Hunter Morvan (25GB, 7TA) will need to lead the host of battle-tested, hard-working freshmen and sophomores.

**Plano West (2007: 3-9): (2006: 7-6):** First year Head Coach Mark Purcell knew that this year would be a rebuilding year for the Plano West Wolves. The Wolves lost 12 seniors from the previous year and only returned 4 starters.

Non-conference and inter-district victories included Austin Anderson (10-3) and Kingwood (10-9) as well as wins over historic foe, Plano East (6-3). The Wolves best games may have been a tightly contested loss to inter-state rival Pope (9-6) and the first half against Highland Park where they held the Scots scoreless.

Attack Garrett Purcel (6G, 8A) and Middle Nick Martin (20G, 6A) provided the majority of offense. Martin is a good sized middle with an excellent right hand shot and the potential to play at the college level.

Defenseman Evan Pixley (25 GB's, 10 TA's) and Goalie Sean Lefton headed up a defense that improved throughout the season. The Wolves look forward to the future as their numbers in their youth and JV programs continue to grow. - Submitted by Mike Crimmins



## 2007 CENTRAL DISTRICT DIVISION I SEASON SUMMARY

*This season was one of change for the Central District with two new coaches joining growing programs and two coaches leaving after years of developing their programs from DII into DI. It was also a season of continued parity in the middle with final tournament seedings not decided until the last game of the season.*

**Austin High**, led by Coach Andy Garrigan was the leader in the Central and finished with an undefeated district record of 7-0. Highlights of Maroons' season included a last minute victory over Central District rival St. Mary's Hall and an Inter-District victory over St. John's in a hard fought 8-4 game. Austin hit their district stride after a Spring Break trip with tough games against ESD, Highland Park, and St. Mark's. A trip to the State Championship semi-finals in 2006 provided motivation and experience for the team.

**St. Mary's Hall**, led by Coach Tim Florence finished second in the Central. After a lone loss to Austin High on a last minute goal the Barons reeled off six straight district wins to lock up the #2 seed in the district playoffs. They are led by a strong defense which includes two All-State defenders and an All-State goalie.

The battle in the Central was for playoff spots 3-6 with teams trading off wins against each other to add confusion to the mix. **The McCallum Knights** led by their new coach Ben Hewitt wrapped up 3rd seed and defeated Westlake in the preliminary round of playoffs to reach the semi-finals. The Knights are a young team anchored by a few Seniors so expect to see more excitement from them in 2008.

**The Westwood Warriors** led by first year Coach Evan Whelchel finished 4th in the Central and beat nearby rival McNeil to advance to the district semi-finals. The Warriors are an experienced team with a large number of Seniors and lot of underclassmen to fill their roles next year. Catch Westwood and McNeil at the Annual Wild West showdown at the Round Rock ISD Sports Complex also known as The Palace to see sportsmanship and rivalry at its best.

**The McNeil Mavericks** led by veteran Coach Michael Cohen had a good year after the graduation of some key players last season. The Mavericks are a young team and gained a lot of experience this season and capped their year with a victory over Westlake to lock up the 5th seed before falling to rival Westwood in the first round of the playoffs.

**Westlake**, led by Coach Dave Lapin locked up the 6th spot in the Central to make the playoffs again. The Chapparals continue to produce talented teams filled with good athletes. The youth programs in Westlake are some of the strongest in Austin so watch for continued growth and positive results from this team in the future.

**St. Andrew's** and **Anderson** finished out of the playoff hunt this year. St. Andrew's will be losing Coach Chris Mele who has been involved as the leader of this program for several years and grew it from a DII team into a DI program. Chris leaves a young team with potential for next year. Anderson loses Coach Bruce Clark who also grew this team from a DII program into a DI team. Bruce was instrumental in establishing the youth leagues in Austin and he leaves Anderson with a strong crop of underclassmen that came up through this feeder program. The Central District will miss these two coaches and the contributions they have made to Texas lacrosse. Best of luck to both Chris and Bruce.

The Central District continues to grow in numbers and parity of play between the teams so 2008 holds the promise of more competition and hard fought games to see who will represent the district in Houston. - Submitted by Al Picazo

## 2007 SOUTH DISTRICT DIVISION I SEASON SUMMARY

*In 2006, THSLL State Champion St. John's rolled over its fellow district members by an average of almost 11 goals. For 2007, the Mavericks repeated their undefeated district schedule, but did so in much closer games. In their game against Kinkaid, St. John's scored five goals in the second half to defeat a resurgent Kinkaid team (6-5). In their next game against Lamar, St. John's scratched out a win (2-1). St. John's only two losses were in a rematch of last years champion-*

*ship games with The Episcopal School of Dallas (1-7) and Central foe Austin High. Led by All-State players Peter Guffey, Walter Schiffer and Adam Hines, St. John's for the third year in a row, go into the district playoffs with a number one seed.*

**Episcopal Houston** improved in 2007 by going 5-1 in district games and undefeated in inter-district games against McCallum (13-2) and Plano (15-9). Episcopal also proved resilient in close games by edging out St. Mary's Hall in triple overtime (8-7), beating Kinkaid (9-8) and Austin (10-8). Episcopal's only loss in THSLL play was against rival St. John's (10-7). Led by offensive minded head coach Mike Donnelly, the Knights were none the less defensively strong, attributed to All-State and All-American candidate defenseman Carter Johnson. On offense, Episcopal was counted on senior Neat Clark (All-State) and also possessed a very strong stable of middies including All-State awardees McCay Dickson and John Hornbuckle and All-District winner Trevor Tamlyn. Going into the playoffs, as a number two seed, Episcopal Houston is looking to make a return to the State Championships after missing out in 2005 and 2006.

**The Kinkaid Falcons** got defensive this year by allowing only 4.2 goals per game. Kinkaid went 4-2 in District games and 2-0 in Inter-district play including a victory over Highland Park (10-7). Kinkaid's only two losses were against St. John's and Episcopal Houston (9-8). In the game against St. John's, Kinkaid led 4-1 at halftime, but Kinkaid had trouble maintaining possession in the second half and St. John's rallied to win (5-6). Gaining a third seed in the playoffs, Kinkaid stifled Lamar (7-1) to advance to the second round. Kinkaid's strong showing this year was based on 14 seniors on the roster including Byron Langford on defense (All-State), Evans Finger at Attack (All-District), Austin Fatjo and John Spradling (both All-District middies) and William Simmons at long stick middle (All-State). After losing so many players to graduation after 2007, Kinkaid will look forward to the return of junior All-State goalie Boone Bajgier for 2008.

**The Woodlands** slowed down a bit in 2007, dropping to the fourth seed in the playoffs after gaining the third seed for 2005 and 2006. The Woodlands went 3-3 in district games with win over Strake Jesuit (8-7), Lamar (7-2), Kingwood (11-4) and also steam rolled their Inter-district game with Central District's St. Mary's Hall (19-5). Having played Strake Jesuit close in their regular season game, The Woodlands struggled in the first round playoff rematch with the Crusaders (11-4). For 2008, The Highlanders return Will McCance (All-State Attack), Josh Kovach (All-District Middle) and Stephen Magee (All-District Long Stick Midfielder), but will lose senior Adam Campbell (All-District Defenseman).


**Strake Jesuit**, a 1-5 team in district play, was a stubborn opponent for the rest of the district. Under first year head coach Mike Block, the Crusaders lost to Episcopal Houston (6-10), the Woodlands (7-8), St. John's (4-7), Lamar (7-8) and Kinkaid (4-8). By virtue of their stronger showing against the rest of the district, Strake won a fifth seed in the district playoffs and upset the Woodlands (11-4). In the second round, Strake will face #1 seed St. John's and a possibility to advance to the District Championship. For 2007, Strake player Reid Fontenot was awarded All-District honors at attack.

**Lamar** improved slightly in 2007, going 1-5 in district and narrowly winning the last playoff spot. Beating Strake Jesuit (9-8) in district play, Lamar finished their regular season by losing to #1 seed St. John's by the unusually low score of (1-2). Unfortunately for Lamar, their lack of offense hurt them in their playoff loss to Kinkaid (1-7). ## 2007 CENTRAL DISTRICT DIVISION II SEASON SUMMARY

Competition, sportsmanship, stability, skill growth, and matriculation marked DII Central season. One nine-overtime and two five-overtime contests typified the competitive spirit evident across the district. One-point game results were common week-in and week-out. At season's end each of the three sub-districts standings bell-curved with a clear winner at the top, most teams bunched together in the middle, and one team that took it on the chin during a rebuilding year in last place. Championship Week seedings reflected the season's competition and growth. #1, St. Stephen's and #2, Bowie, not only won the Capital and Hill Country crowns, but were accepted for advancement into DI for 2008 play. Dark horse #3, St. Anthony's cobbled together an at-large club that won the Alamo laurels despite challenges from Central Catholic, Reagan, and TMI. #4, Cedar Park continued its steady organizational and membership growth finishing second to Bowie while perennial threat Central Catholic finished as the fifth seed. Coach Tim Holland's work at Regents of Austin rounded out the playoff picture.

Improved sportsmanship was a goal across the division. Each club's skill growth and team play demonstrated that it had left the days of wood-chopping and take-out checks in its dust. This year the presidents and coaches brought self-control, bench language and field conduct in line with skill growth. At year's end game reports repeatedly praised the sportsmanship exhibited by DII teams, and one official characterized this as a "quiet year" when asked about the absence of sportsmanship issues.

DII clubs expanded feeder programs throughout the region. Bowie fostered a team at Bailey Middle School and plans a summer league that includes elementary through high school players. Cedar Park and Leander continue to support Town and Country Optimist League and negotiated an agreement that will manage the growth of the sport in LISD over the next few years. Stony Point and LBJ are networking to establish middle school programs in their attendance zones. TMI plans a middle school team for 2008.

One of the most positive stories of the season has been the increasing stability in both the club leadership and the coaching ranks. Qualified, mature and dedicated lacrosse coaches are difficult to find, much less retain. Yet, across the region the same role models with the same values, standards and strategies are returning for a third, fourth or, even, tenth year. These leaders prove seasoned enough to work through the full cycle of ups and downs to carve out systems that benefit kids in the on the field and in life. Due special recognition are the 2007 Coaches of the Year, Caleb Colon of Harker Heights and Chris Knight of Cedar Park. Colon was named Rookie of the Year for stepping in as the fourth Knights coach in a year. (The other three were deployed to Iraq where one was wounded.) Despite instability and raw talent, Caleb guided his squad to a 4-7 record overall in its second year of existence. Veteran Coach of the Year, Chris Knight quietly continued to build Timberwolf squads that challenged the best in the district and grew in size and cohesion, earning a 12-6 record overall and second place in the Hill Country sub-district.

The mission of DII lacrosse remains expanding the sport across central Texas while developing squads with the necessary resources and skill sets to advance to and compete at the DI level. Much is left to do on both fronts. Ten of twelve remaining teams rank in the bottom third of Texas DII power rankings. Not every club has a set of feeder programs that will produce players who bring basic lacrosse sense, skills and knowledge to DII JV's. Coaches are scarce, under or unpaid, and spread too thin. But they are producing better players and teams despite these obstacles. Feeder programs will compete for scarce coaching talent, and a balance must be met here. There is good news. Nearly every club fields some variation of camp, clinic, and/or league to build the base and skill sets of young players. Volunteer club presidents and cabinets donate thousands of hours a year to support coaches, players and the game in ways that often meet or exceed the results produced by on-campus athletic programs. Athletic directors, principals and school boards are recognizing the quality of these volunteers' work. More of our squads are playing on their home campuses. Liaison with administrators at the high and middle school levels is improving, and more than one public school athletic director has recommended lacrosse to his football players as the best off-season competitive conditioner. - submitted by Joe Perkins







# RULES OF THE GAME

## BASIC LACROSSE RULES

Men's lacrosse is a contact game played by ten players: a goalkeeper, three defensemen, three midfielders and three attackmen. The object of the game is to shoot the ball into the opponent's goal. The team scoring the most goals wins.

Each team must keep at least four players, including the goalie, in its defensive half of the field and three in its offensive half. Three players (midfielders) may roam the entire field.

Generally, high school games are 48 minutes long, with 12 minute quarters. Each team is given a two minute break between the first and second quarters, and the third and fourth quarters. Half-time is ten minutes long.

Teams change sides between periods. Each team is permitted two time-outs each half. The team winning the coin toss chooses the end of the field it wants to defend first.

Men's lacrosse begins with a face-off. The ball is placed between the sticks of two squatting players at the center of the field. The official blows the whistle to begin play. Each face-off player tries to control the ball. The players in the wing areas can release; the other players must wait until one player has gained possession of the ball or the ball has crossed the goal line.

Center face-offs are also used after a goal and at the start of each quarter.

Players may run with the ball in the crosse, pass and catch the ball. Only the goalkeeper may touch the ball with his hands.

A player may gain possession of the ball by dislodging it from an opponent's crosse with a stick check, which includes the controlled poking and slapping of the stick and gloved hands of the player in possession of the ball.

Body checking is permitted if the opponent has the ball. However, all contact must occur from the front or side, above the waist and below the shoulders. An opponent's crosse may also be stick checked if it is within five yards of a loose ball or ball in the air.

If the ball or a player in possession of the ball goes out of bounds, the other team is awarded possession of the ball. If the ball goes out of bounds after an unsuccessful shot on goal, the player nearest to the ball when and where it goes out of bounds is awarded possession.

An attacking player cannot enter the crease around the goal, but may reach in with his stick to scoop a loose ball.

## LACROSSE LINGO

**Clamping** - On the face-off, a player pushes the back of his stick down on the ball in the attempt to gain control of it.

**Clearing** - An important defensive maneuver where defending players run or pass the ball out of their goal area. Clearing is best done along the sidelines, away from the front of the goal.

**Cradling** - In order to maintain control of the ball when moving along the field, players turn their wrists and arms to cradle the ball in the stick pocket.

**Crank Shot** - A shot on goal in which a player takes a backswing wind-up and fires the ball underhand or sidearm.

**Crease** - The eighteen-foot diameter circle surrounding each team's goal.

**Cutting** - An attacking player without the ball darts around a defender toward the goal in order to receive a "feed pass."

**Extra Man (or Man Up)** - Describes the team at a player advantage in a penalty situation. Opposite of man down.

**Face-off** - Takes place at the start of each quarter, after every goal, and after certain dead balls. Two opposing players crouch down at midfield, hold their sticks flat on the ground and press the backs of their stick pockets together. The ball is then placed between the pockets and, when signaled to start, the players "rake" or clamp on the ball to vie for control.

**Face Dodging** - A player with the ball cradles the stick across his face in an attempt to dodge a stick-poking defender.

**Fast Break** - When an offensive team quickly mounts a scoring attack enabling them to gain a man advantage over the opposing defense. Usually a four on three.

**Feed Pass** - An offensive play in which one player passes the ball to a cutting teammate for a "quick stick" shot on goal.

**Ground Balls** - Players compete for the control of loose ground balls by stick checking opponents away from the ball while simultaneously trying to scoop it up.

**Man Down** - Describes the team which has lost a player to the penalty box and must play with fewer men on the field.

**Man-to-man** - A defensive setup in which each defending player guards a specific offensive opponent.

**Out-of-bounds** - When a shot goes out of play, the player closest to the sideline where the ball went out gets the ball.

**Passing** - An integral part to quickly moving the ball. Players throw overhand, underhand, or sidearm to each other.

**Pick** - An offensive player without the ball positions himself against the body of a defender to allow a teammate to get open and receive a pass or take a shot.

**Pocket** - The head of the stick in which the ball is held and carried. The pocket is strung with leather and/or mesh netting.

**Quick Stick** - When the ball reaches an offensive player's stick on a feed pass, he catches it and then shoots it toward the goal in one swift motion.

**Raking** - A face-off move by a player who, in trying to gain possession of the ball, sweeps it away from his opponent.

**Riding** - When an attacking team loses possession of the ball, it must quickly revert to playing defense in order to prevent the ball from being cleared back out.


**Roll Dodge** - An offensive move in which a ballcarrier, using his body as a shield between a defensive player and the cradled ball, spins around the defender.

**Scooping** - The manner in which a player picks up loose ground balls. He bends toward the ground, slides the pocket of his stick underneath the ball, and lifts it into the netting of the stick.

**Screen** - An attacking player without possession of the ball positions himself in front of the opposing goal crease in an effort to block the goalkeeper's view.

**Slide** - When an offensive player with the ball has gotten past his defender, a defending teammate will shift his position to pick up that advancing player.

**Zone Defense** - When defenders play in specific areas of their defensive zone, rather than covering man-to-man.

**SPORTSMANSHIP GUIDELINES**

Any person acting in an unacceptable manner faces expulsion from the contest. Remember it is a privilege to watch these young men compete and it should be an honor to support their efforts. Let's remember that the actions we take speak louder and last longer than anything we say. At the end of the day, what kind of fan will you be and what kind of message will you send to the players, coaches, other fans, and the officials?

**ACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR**

- Know the rules and strategies of the contest in order to cheer at proper times
- Maintain enthusiasm and composure, serving as a role model
- Participate positively in the event or contest by supporting the coaches and participants
- Exercise good judgment in cheering for outstanding performance, not against opponents or to ridicule an error. It is certainly acceptable to applaud on outstanding performance by an opponent and to applaud all participants at the end of the contest
- Be an exemplary role model by positively supporting teams in every manner possible including content of cheers and signs
- Show respect and concern for an injured player, regardless of team
- Respect decisions made by contest officials
- Realize that a ticket represents a privilege and a responsibility to observe and positively support a high school activity, not a license to verbally assault others or be generally obnoxious
- Respect fans, coaches, and participants
- Encourage surrounding fans to display only sportsmanlike conduct
- Resist being drawn into negative conduct by other fans, including opposing fans

**UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR**

- Disrespectful or derogatory yells, chants, songs or gestures
- Booming or heckling an official's decision, criticizing officials in any way, displays of temper with an official's call
- Yells that antagonize opponents
- Blaming loss of game on officials, coaches or participants
- Doing own yells instead of following lead of cheerleaders
- Yelling at or criticizing coaches or participants of either team
- Attempting to coach from the bleachers or sidelines, giving specific instructions to any participant
- Destruction of property, signs or equipment
- Running onto the floor or field of play before, during or after the contest
- Engaging an opposing fan in a dispute or argument
- Use of profane, vulgar or abusive language

**NCAA RULE 2, SECTION 4**

- The head coach also shall be in control of and be responsible for the actions of any and all persons officially connected with his or her institution.
- Coaches shall assist the officials in keeping the game under control. It shall be their duty, upon the request of an official, to control effectively actions of spectators not in conformity with standards of proper conduct.
