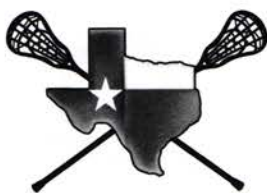

TEXAS HIGH SCHOOL LACROSSE LEAGUE



History

The Texas High School Lacrosse League (THSLL) (the "League"), though not named at the time, started with three high schools in Houston, Texas in 1987: Kinkaid, Memorial, and St. John's. The teams were started by three energetic student athletes from each school, all friends.

The first champion, St. John's, was crowned in 1988 in an unofficial tournament. Since that time, the sport of lacrosse in Texas has grown exponentially, fueled by other energetic young student athletes, coaches, administrators, and fans. The first official THSLL champion was Lamar, crowned by Randy Bryan the THSLL Commissioner, in 1989, after a hard fought victory over St. John's.

Overview

The THSLL is over 83 Member School Programs strong in 2013, and is home to 153 Varsity and JV Teams and over 3,700 high school student athletes across the State of Texas. The THSLL provides the environment for a positive experience and motivation for success - in lacrosse, the classroom, and in life beyond high school; helping build self-esteem and confidence; teaching teamwork and discipline; promoting pride and belonging, and offering an excellent avenue for exercise, competition, and recreation.

The Texas Scholastic Lacrosse Association, Inc. (TSLA) is the governing body for the THSLL. The THSLL is the membership association for boys' lacrosse (THSLL Member School Programs) at the high school level in Texas, defined as grades nine through twelve.

Guiding Principles

1. Creating a structured environment in which student athletes, coaches, administrators, and parents benefit from membership in an organization that facilitates the growth and rewards of playing lacrosse.
2. Promoting and protecting the health of participating student athletes by establishing uniform rules of play and cultivating the ideals of good sportsmanship, loyalty, and fair play.
3. Working in harmony with the interscholastic governing bodies of THSLL Member School Programs, and other concerned Texas constituencies.
4. Establishing and maintaining a process for continuous improvement of the League, by working with THSLL Member School Programs, and other concerned Texas constituencies.
5. Building school based boy's lacrosse Teams in Texas (all players on a Team attend the same source high school, ideally lacrosse is recognized as a school sport by the athletic director, and if a public high school recognized as a school sport by the independent school district.)

Division I is made up of Member School Programs that are more established lacrosse programs. DI teams have bylaws, procedures, a designated head coach and president, reasonable relations with their host school and/or city / community, and a JV and Varsity high school Teams which play a full back to back JV and Varsity schedule.

Division II is targeted at development of lacrosse programs. Division II Member School Programs generally have bylaws, procedures, a designated head coach and president, reasonable relations with their host school and/or city / community, and at least JV and Varsity high school Teams.

Division III is made up of new or relatively new lacrosse Teams, still working towards critical mass of players, coaches, funding, fields, administrative support and school / city / community support.

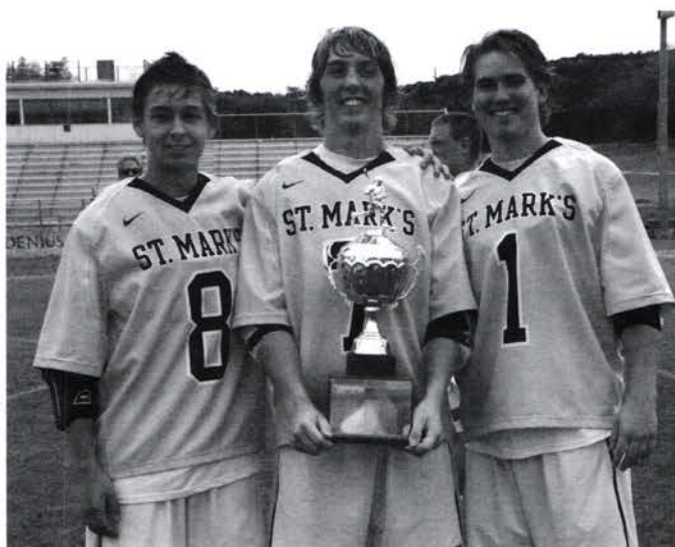

2013 THSLL DIVISION I CENTRAL DISTRICT

Season Recap

Westlake- Westlake High again won the district with an undefeated district record for the 2nd consecutive year. Coach Whelchel's squad finished the year with a heartbreaking loss to St. Marks in the Austin Super Regional. Coach Whelchel leaves Westlake with the cupboard full with 16 returning D1 varsity players, 22 D2 players, 23 JV players and a feeder program comprised of 328 players in grades 1st-8th.

Anderson- the Anderson High Trojans finished 2nd in the district with a 6-2 district record. The Trojans won in spite of having a thin roster with very few long sticks. Coach Kurzweil was awarded the Central District Coach of the year honors for the superior accomplishments he was able to produce with his team this year.

Austin- Austin High said goodbye to their long time coach, Andy Garrigan, and again qualified for post season play in spite of a number of late season injuries. The Maroons started the year with a team with very little varsity experience and continued to improve throughout the season, finishing the year with a 6-2 district record. Their record placed Austin High as the 3rd place finisher and qualified the team for a trip to the Austin Super Regional.

Bowie- the Bowie Bulldogs Bowie had an incredible turn around this year. After finishing last season 2-5 in district play, Bowie finished this season with a 5-3 district record, and qualified for the Super Regional for the first time in three years. Coach Becker was recognized by his peers for the tremendous progress the Bulldogs made this year.

Cedar Park- Cedar Park's young team continued to improve throughout the year and finished the year with 3 district wins. Coach Liberatore's Timberwolves are only graduating 4 seniors and are looking forward to an improved record in 2014. The Timberwolves are planning to continue to improve and challenge for a playoff spot next year.

Lake Travis- The Central D1 welcomed Lake Travis to D1 raising the number of teams in Central D1 to 9. Lake Travis performed admirably in their first season as a D1 program. The Lake Travis Cavaliers finished their inaugural season with 3 district wins. The team is only graduating 4 seniors and Coach Galvin is hoping to leverage the lessons from their first year in D1 into a playoff appearance in 2014.

Westwood- It was a rebuilding year for the Westwood Warriors. The Warriors battled in every game and fought to a 3 win district record. The team graduates only 5 seniors and has a substantial number of returning starters. Coach Booth is focused on helping the warriors compete to represent the district in the 2014 super regional.

Alamo Heights- The San Antonio based Alamo Heights Mules finished 2013 district play with 2 wins. The team continues to improve and the Mules performed valiantly after traveling 1-1/2 to 2 hours for their entire non-home district schedule. Coach Monnich is continuing to build the Mules youth program in an effort to improve the Mules results in the coming years.

St. Stephens- The St Stephens Spartans had a great group of young men this season on the team. The team continued to fight all season and improved as a group every week. With only graduating one senior, the team will be ready to work hard over the summer and winter as individuals to prepare for a successful 2014 season. Coach Fink is looking forward to a much improved 2014 with his more experienced club.

The Central District Division I will bid farewell to two of its longest tenured and most respected head coaches. Coach Garrigan, who had been with Austin High since 2003, and had won 5 district championships, announced at the beginning of the season that he had accepted the position of head coach for the University of Texas Men's Lacrosse team. Coach Garrigan coached both Austin High and UT during the 2013 season and was able to lead both of his squads into post season play. The season closed with the announcement that Evan Whelchel, the head coach at Westlake, would also be leaving at the end of the 2013 season. During his tenure, Coach Whelchel had elevated the Westlake program into one of the top programs in the state. Evan and his family will be moving to North Carolina. The Central District will miss the leadership of these two coaches and wishes both of them the best.

2013 THSLL DIVISION I SOUTH DISTRICT

Season Recap

The Woodlands - Winners of the South District in 2013 by going undefeated in both district and out of district play. In an early season matchup, first year head coach Keith Tintle led the Highlanders to a 13-4 victory over eventual second place finisher St. John's. The Woodlands won over THSLL 2012 State Champion Highland Park in a super low scoring contest 3-2. In district play, The Woodlands overpowered their opponents by an average twelve goals per game while only giving up an average of 3.5 goals per game. Out of district teams did not fare much better with the Highlanders overpowering Coppell 7-5, Plano West 7-5, Westlake 12-5 and Westwood 17-3. The Woodlands perfect regular season record earned head coach Keith Tintle a unanimous selection as the THSLL South District coach of the year. The Woodlands squad dominated the South All State ranks with seven overall selections, including attackman Gus Pinsoneault and Adam Lowell, defensemen Kyle Glaesmann and Cameron Babin, goalie Hayden Stanifer and midfielders Ben Lipscomb and Sean McCanna. Sean McCanna was also selected the South District MVP.

The Woodlands perfect record ended with a loss to Episcopal Dallas (ESD) at the Houston Super Regional. After the Woodlands jumped to a 4-1 lead in the first quarter, ESD scored five goals in the second quarter to go ahead of the Woodlands 6-5. By the end of the third quarter, ESD extended their lead to 9-6, and scored another goal in the fourth quarter before the Woodlands rallied to tie the game at 10-10. ESD put a stop to the Woodlands rally by scoring a go ahead goal with less than two minutes left in the game, winning 11-10, thus ending The Woodlands hopes of advancing to the State Championships.

St. John's-Placing second in the south district for 2013, the St. John's Mavericks team was led by a school record 15 seniors and finished the season with a 9-1 in District play. St. John's scored wins over Kingwood 9-4, St. Thomas 15-3, Strake Jesuit 11-7, Episcopal Houston 9-5, Seven Lakes 13-2, Kinkaid 11-3, and Lamar 14-2. During the Mavericks game against Houston Christian, St. John's eked out a victory 7-6. In the Memorial game, St. Johns went up on Memorial 6-1 at the half and held off a late rally for a THSLL win at Grob Stadium. On a pristine Friday night, playing at Grob Stadium for the first time, St. John's worked one of their best halves of lacrosse that would be good enough for their seventh conference win. After Peter Cordill '15 started things off with a goal assisted by William Griffin '13 in the first minute of play, the Mavericks kept cashing in for a 7-1 lead midway through the third period. Memorial rallied in the fourth period, but the Mavericks matched the Mustangs down the stretch and William Trieschman '14 recorded a game high 17 saves. St. John's advanced to the Austin Super Regional and easily beat Austin High 13-7, but fell the next day to 2012 State Champion Highland Park, 12-6. Earning post season honors for St. John's in 2013 are goalie William Trieschman (All State), Defenseman Ben Griffin (All State), long stick middle Logan Smith (All State), middle Jonathan Newar (All State), attackman David Edwards (All District) and midfielder Carl Bernicker (All District).

Houston Christian-In their third season competing in Division I, Houston Christian hopes of repeating as district champions in 2013 hit a few road bumps with losses to Kingwood 5-6, St. John's 6-7 and Woodlands 7-17. Too make matters worse, All State attackman and All American candidate Brooks Lehle suffered a season ending concussion in the Kinkaid game, putting a damper on the Mustangs' offense during the stretch run. Gaining the third seed in the south district, Houston Christian advanced to the Austin Super Regional against St. Marks, but lost 11-2. For post season honors, midfielders Connor Pryor and Ivan Morris joined Brooks Lehle at All State along with midfielder Simon Doucet at All District and defenseman Michael Grandjean, also at All District.

Episcopal Houston - A 7-3 record with wins over Seven Lakes 13-5, Strake Jesuit 6-4, Kingwood 7-6, Memorial 7-1, St. Thomas 18-1, Kinkaid 9-5 and Lamar 14-1. The Knights however were defeated by The Woodlands 12-3, St. John's 9-5, and Houston Christian 5-3. Episcopal placed fourth in the south district and faced # 5 seed Memorial in the district playoffs. After playing to a 5-5 tie in the third quarter, the Knights finished off Memorial 9-7 to advance to the Houston Super Regionals. Facing Anderson in the first round, the Saturday game was rained out and the game was forced to be played on Sunday. In the early morning game, EHS beat Anderson 15-6 and turned right around to face a powerful Dallas Jesuit team later in the day. EHS initially slowed down Dallas Jesuit with an outstanding effort by goalie Harrison Proffitt, but Episcopal eventually fell 13-2 to end their season. For 2013 post season honors, midfielder Jack Powell earned All District honors along with All District defenseman Mitchell Webber.

Memorial - In their fourth season in Division I, they reached the district playoffs for the first time in 2013, finishing 6-4 in district play, including wins over Kinkaid, Seven Lakes, Lamar, St. Thomas, Strake Jesuit and Kingwood. The Mustangs gave Houston Christian all they could handle but ended up losing 10-9. In their first district Division I playoff game against Episcopal Houston, Memorial played to a 5-5 tie in the third quarter before eventually falling 9-7.

Kingwood- An up and down season, finishing the season 6-4 with wins over Seven Lakes 12-4, Lamar 14-3, Kinkaid 3-2, Strake Jesuit 9-7 and St. Thomas 15-4. Kingwood faced Houston Christian twice during the season. In the district matchup, Kingwood edged out a victory over the 2012 District Champions. Meeting again in the district playoffs, Kingwood played Houston Christian to a 5-5 tie late in the fourth quarter before Houston Christian scored two late goals to ice the victory. Attackman Tucker Bryce won All State honors and was also name an All American finalist. Goalie Nick Hepting earned All District Honors along with defenseman Ian Wood (All District).

Kinkaid- The Kinkaid Falcons slipped in 2013, recording a 4-6 record in district and a 6-8 overall record. Kinkaid picked up victories over Seven Lakes 9-8, St. Thomas 16-1, Lamar 12-4 and Strake Jesuit 8-6, but suffered a couple close losses against Kingwood 2-3 and Houston Christian 8-10. One bright spot for Kinkaid this year was the performance of Lucas Cooper, who earned All State Honors by dominating opponents at face offs, winning 165 out of 236 face off tries and picking up 72 ground balls. All District honors also went to attackman Connor Sullivan, long stick middle Robert Reinbolt and defenseman Sam Chapman.

Strake Jesuit -Suffered through a disappointing season, going 3-7 in district and 3-17 overall. Despite the season, the Crusaders still managed to pick up post season honors, with Elijah Cherry winning All-State at defense, Erik Rowley as an All-District attackman and Miles Cantrell as an All-District midfielder.

Seven Lakes- Formerly Cinco Ranch, went 2-7 in District and 6-7 overall, while Lamar registered a single victory against St. Thomas 8-5. St. Thomas really struggled this year, failing to win a single district game, but scored two wins out of district against Central Catholic 9-8 and Bellaire 17-3.

Due to the huge growth of lacrosse in Houston, programs at the youth, middle school and high school level need parents of today's player to be active and volunteer their time to improve the quality of the game in Texas for future players. 2013 THSLL DIVISION I NORTH DISTRICT

Season Recap

The 2013 THSLL Division I North District continued its long-standing tradition of fierce competitive battles, non-stop action, and a tight district race with four teams separated by one game. The final standings going down to the last District game on the last day of the 2013 THSLL Regular Season.

Highland Park, the 2012 THSLL State Division I Champions, once again proved why they are a perennial favorite to make the Finals each year as they were crowned the 2013 North District DI Champions, with a district record of 9 - 1. Dallas Jesuit, also with a 9 - 1 record, lost the tie breaker with its only loss a head to head match up to Highland Park. ESD and St. Mark's, with mirrored 7-2 records, finished third and fourth respectively with ESD gaining the tie breaker by beating St. Marks early in the season, 9 to 7. To illustrate the parity of the District, St. Mark's, #4, was the lone victor over Highland Park, #1, in the regular season. As a result of their exemplary play throughout the season, all four teams earned their way into the State Playoffs with HP and St. Mark's playing in the Central Super-Regionals in while Jesuit and ESD will represent the North in the South Super-Regionals. Should all four teams be successful at their respective Super-Regionals they could all end up playing in the Final Four as a part of the THSLL State Championship Weekend hosted in Plano, Texas, Saturday and Sunday, May 4th and 5th.

The defending 2012 THSLL DI State Champions, Highland Park, rebounded nicely from season opening loss in February to Woodlands (3 to 2) to win ten straight games before losing to St. Mark's in the final game of the regular season after locking up first place. Just as in 2012, HP coach, Derek Thomson, patiently prepared his team, improving each week looking forward to the playoffs.

Three HP players gained All-State District I Honors: Bryce Green (#33 - 2013) All-State Attack, Robert Mencke (#27 - 2014) All-State Midfield, and Matthew Meaders (#25 - 2013) All-State Goalie. All-District players for Highland Park DI: Remy Kell (#8 - 2014) All-District Defense, Hilton Kennington (#20 - 2013) All District Defense and Christopher Marlow (#5 - 2014) All-District Midfield.

Dallas Jesuit, the 2013 THSLL Season North District DI Runner-ups, played a solid THSLL season going undefeated in league play until a narrow loss to Highland Park 7 - 6 on the tenth game of the league season. The Rangers, coached by Chris Surran, continued their history of playing a difficult non-league schedule. The 2013 team traveled to King of Spring Face-Off Classic in North Carolina and finished with two solid wins over Charlotte Latin and East Chapel Hill. Their lone loss, 11 - 9 was to perennial national power Gillman. Dallas Jesuit goes to the South Super-Regional as the second seed from the North.

Rangers earning individual awards include five All-State Honorees: Zach Coker (#25 - 2013) All-State Attack, Lee Belland (#0 - 2014) All-State Midfield, Tom Huber (#14 - 2014) All-State Defense, Dan Morris (#8 - 2013) All-State Goalie, and Sam Rosengarden (#44 - 2013) All-State Face-Off. All-District Honors for Dallas Jesuit players - Carson Buell (#7 - 2013) All-District Midfield, Garrett Van De Ven (#15 - 2013) All-District Midfield, and Hank Likes (#36 - 2014) All-District LSM.

Episcopal School of Dallas (ESD), shut out from the Super-Regional playoffs in 2012, bounced back in 2013 with a solid league performance finishing as the third seed from the North District. Coached by Pat Kennedy and led by a number of players committed to play lacrosse in college, the Eagles only suffered two losses all season, close league losses to HP (11 - 8) and Dallas Jesuit (8 - 7) who finished just ahead of them in league standings. Like Dallas Jesuit, ESD ventured east in March to play some of the best lacrosse programs in the Baltimore area and gain valuable playing experience. One regular season highlight was the first meeting with St. Marks in a district battle. Starting a freshman goalie, Charlie Sikes, ESD defeated St. Mark's for the first time in eleven previous meetings. The Eagles season continues as ESD travels to the South Super-Regional in Houston as the third seed from the North District.

Outstanding ESD individual performances resulted in four All-State Honors for ESD players - Richie Loftus (#7 - 2014) All-State Attack, Barrett Anigian (#1 - 2013) All-State Midfield, Sam Romano (#22 - 2015) All-State Midfield and Foster Huggins (#11 - 2014).

St. Mark's, coached by Hayward Lee, finished the regular season as the fourth seed out of the North despite a number of player losses due to transfer and graduation. After early season losses to ESD and Jesuit, the Lions battled back late in the season reminiscent of the 2012 Highland Park team that went on to win the State Championship. In fact, St. Mark's handed HP their lone loss of the season in their last regular season game.

Lion post-season award winners include two All-State Honors - Bear Goldstein (#7 - 2013) All-State Defense, Evan Chang Tung (#12 - 2013) All-State Midfield. All-District performers include: Andrew Graffy (#8 - 2013) All-District Attack, Danny Koudelka (#1 - 2013) All-District Midfield.

Allen, coached by Zack Colburn, improved to eleven wins in the 2013 THSLL Season finishing 5th in District earning a first ever District playoff berth. Led by All-District performers, Drew Barry (#77 - 2014) All-District Attack and Jack Hawkins (#5 - 2013) All-District Midfield, the Eagle showed vast improvement this season. Allen once again returns seventeen Varsity players for the 2014 THSLL Season.

Coppell, Former State Champion team, coached by Alex Poole, had a rebuilding season finishing sixth, qualifying for the District playoffs. The Cowboy offense was led by All-State selection Nick Hruby (#10 - 2014) All-State Attack. The defense was anchored by All-District defender Garrett Choate (#33 - 2013) All-District Defense. Finally, the All-District Face-Off Specialist, D.P. Lambert (#19 - 2014) helped Coppell gain offensive possessions.

Plano, coached by Lance Jacobs, weathered a tough rebuilding year in the 2013 THSLL Season. Missing current University of Denver player, Hunter Gore, All-State Midfield in 2012, the Wildcats are looking forward to 2014 and a number of returning Varsity players.

Plano West, coached by Gary DeSarrano, battled to a 7 - 7 2013 THSLL Season, finishing just out of the District playoffs. Leading Plano West was All-State LSM Brett France (#41 - 2013) while Ryan Schaffer (#0 - 2013) All-District Attack helped on offense and Mac Haug (#31 - 2013) All-District Defense anchored the defense. Still a young team, Plano West will have the majority of their team returning in 2014.

Southlake, coached by Texas newcomer, Bart Sullivan, compiled a 5-8 overall record and 2-6 District record for the 2013 THSLL Season. The highlight of the 2013 THSLL Season was the victory over District playoff team, Allen, a first ever playoff team in Division I. Led by All-District Attack Bryce Wasserman (#9 - 2014) and 16 other returning Varsity players next year along with the new Southlake lacrosse facility, the pieces look to be coming together for a successful 2014 season.

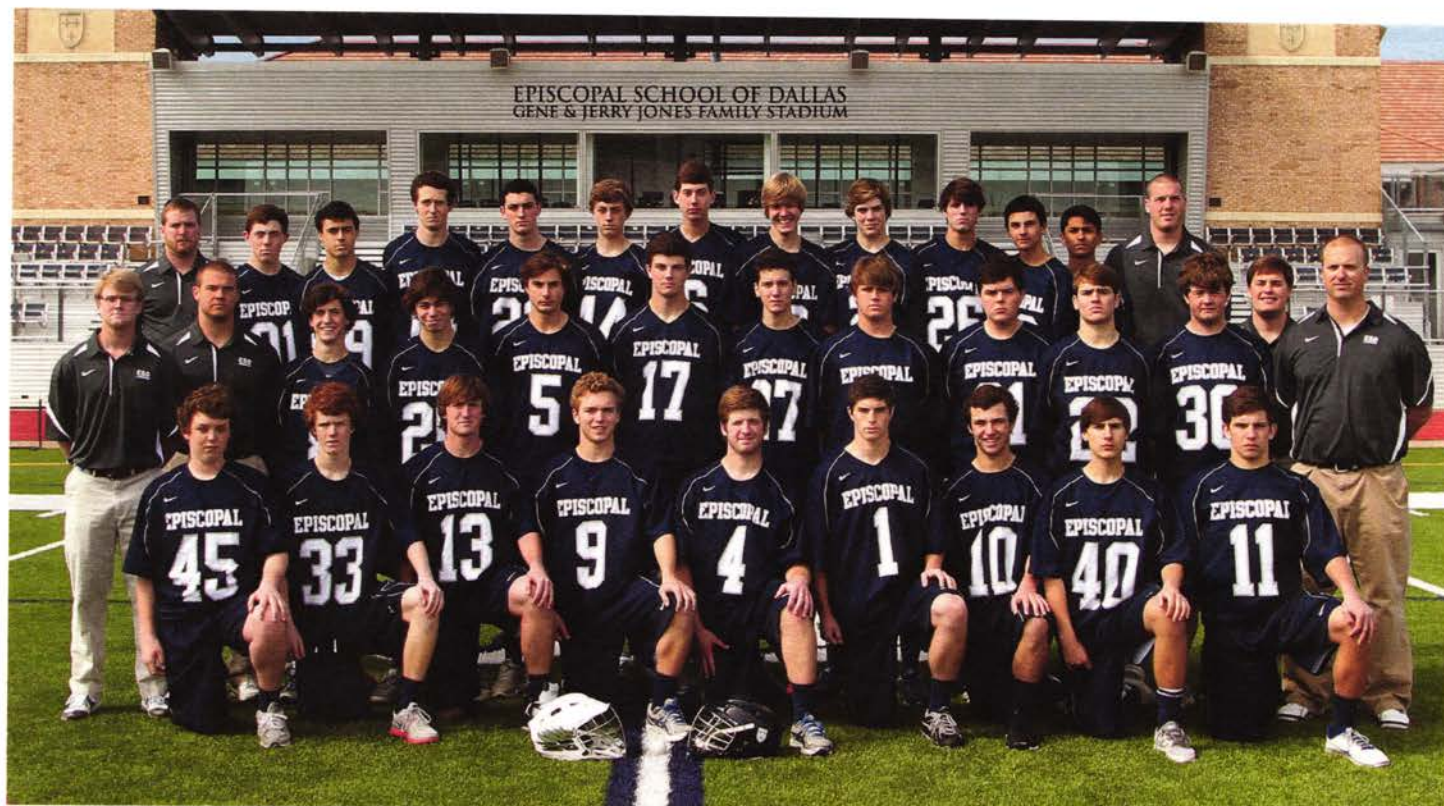

2013 THSLL DIVISION II CENTRAL DISTRICT

Season Recap

NORTH DIVISION

Round Rock (16/1,5/0) Led by veteran Coach Michael Cohen, Round Rock experienced an outstanding regular season going undefeated in District and Division II play with a record of 16-1. Only in its third season, the Dragons produced six All State and All District players. Graduating six seniors, the team will remain competitive next season as it continues to build for the future.

McNeil (12/4, 4/1) The McNeil Mavericks were able to improve their record for a second consecutive year. With Coach Scott Aubin on their sideline, this young team continues to find success against their competition including two season wins over Division I opponents. Head Coach Scott Conrad led the team to their first wins over Division I competition and the team had five All State and All District award winners in 2013. Only losing six seniors this year, this young Georgetown team is already looking forward to what should be an exciting, successful year in 2014.

Rouse (2/7, 1/4) Rouse experienced its first Varsity season learning how to play at the Varsity level and focus points that will be worked on during the off season. The team learned how some teams honor and respect the game. In our second year at the JV level, progress was made to end with a break even season.

Vista Ridge (2/10, 0/5) Vista Ridge: 2-10/0-5: This was a growing season for the Vista Ridge Rangers under first year coach Bill Cafferata. Led by 5 seniors, this group never gave up no matter the circumstances. The team opened the season with only 13 players; however, they quickly doubled the roster through recruiting and word of mouth. 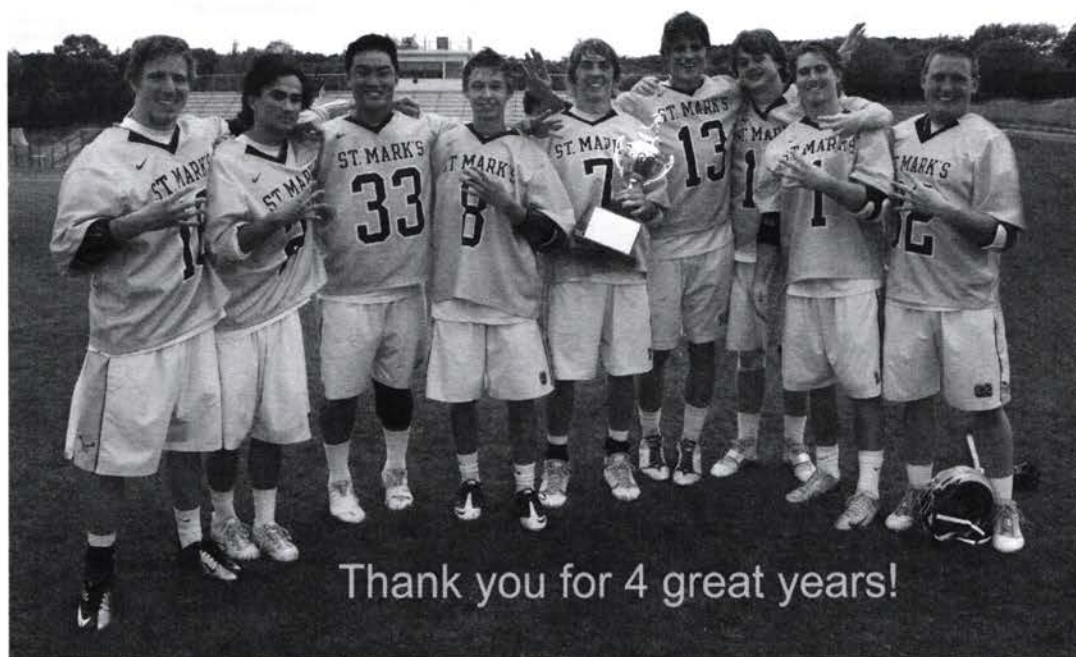
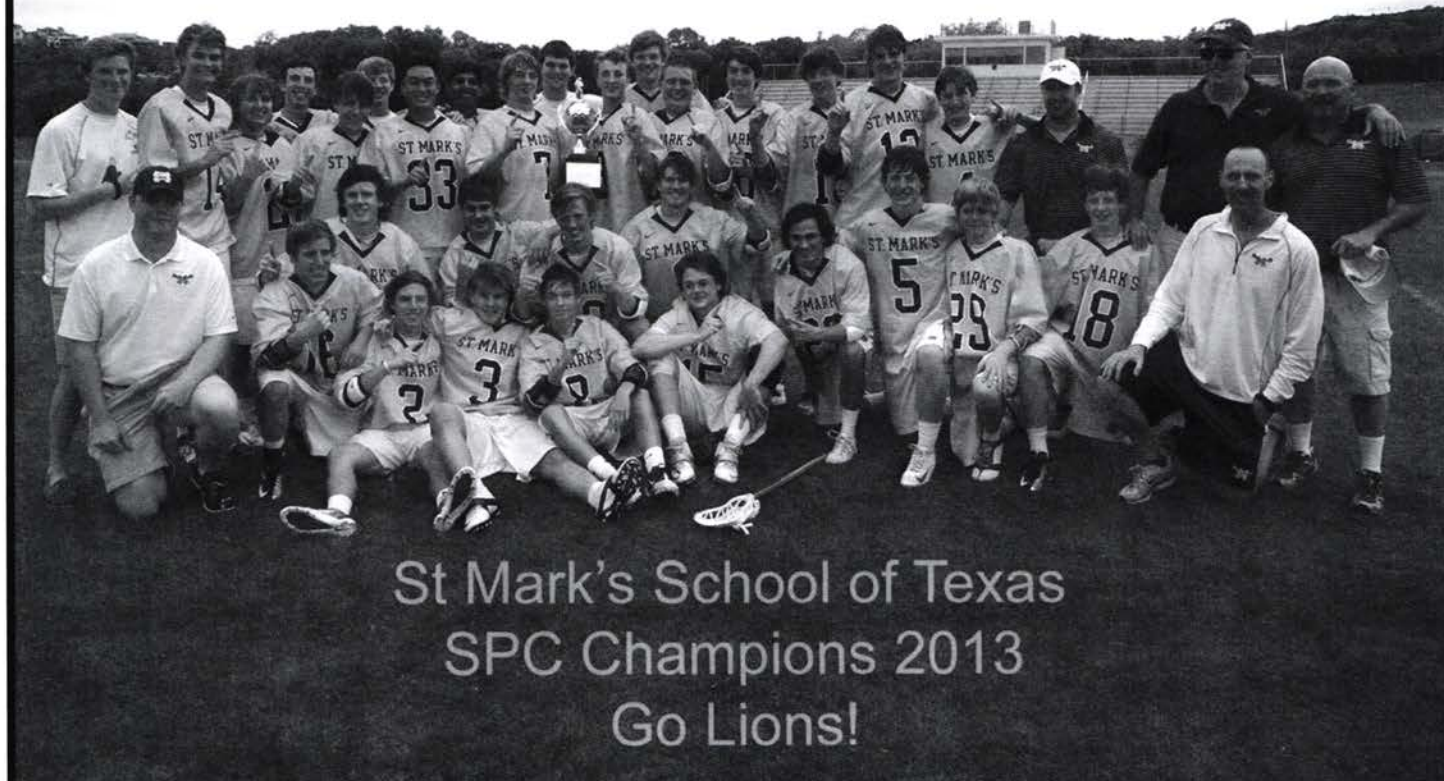

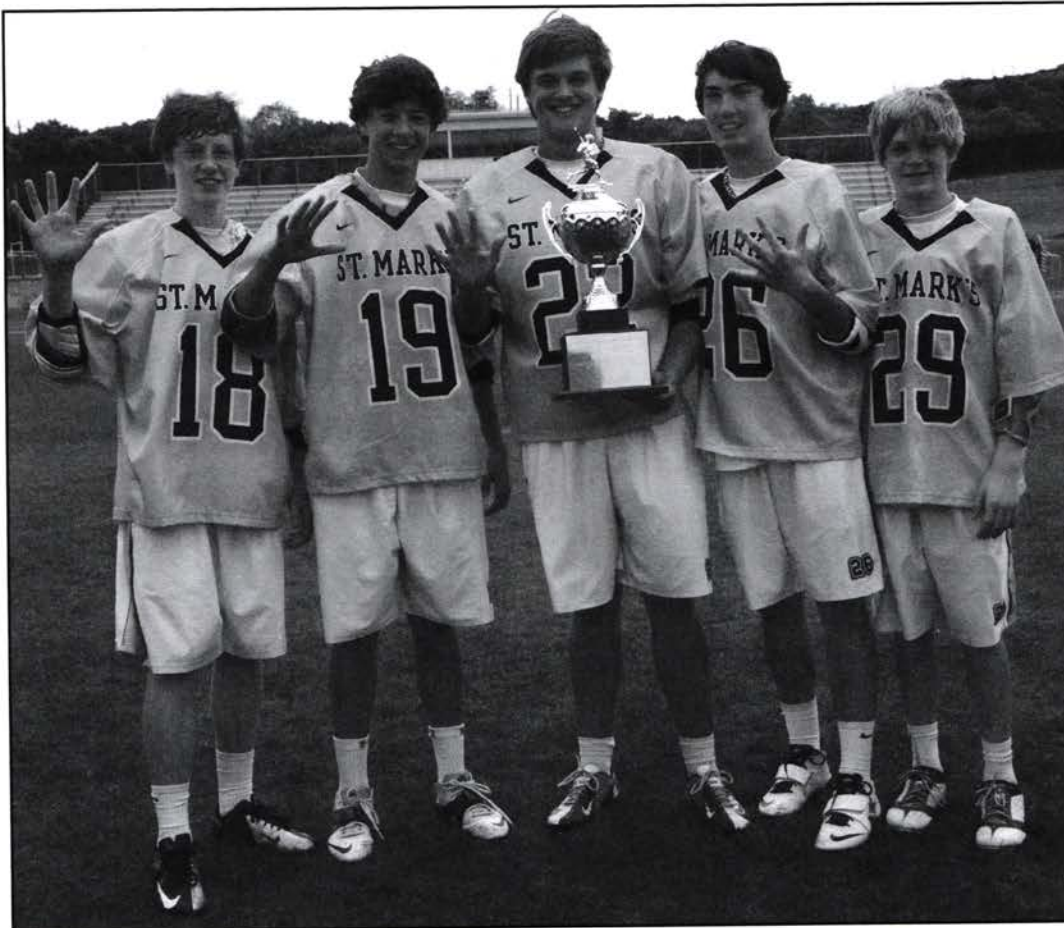
