





HISTORY

The Texas High School Lacrosse League (THSLL) (the "League"), though not named at the time, started with three high schools in Houston, Texas in 1987: Kinkaid, Memorial, and St. John's. The teams were started by three energetic student athletes from each school, all friends.

The first champion, St. John's, was crowned in 1988 in an unofficial tournament. Since that time, the sport of lacrosse in Texas has grown exponentially, fueled by other energetic young student athletes, coaches, administrators, and fans. The first official THSLL State Champion was Lamar, crowned by Randy Bryan the THSLL Commissioner, in 1989, after a hard fought victory over St. John's.

OVERVIEW

THSLL has 89 Member School Programs with 160 Varsity and JV Teams and over 4000 high school student athletes across the State of Texas. The Texas Scholastic Lacrosse Association, Inc. (TSLA) is the governing body for the THSLL. The THSLL is the membership association for boys' lacrosse (THSLL Member School Programs) at the high school level in Texas, defined as grades nine through twelve.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- 1. Creating a structured environment in which student athletes, coaches, administrators, and parents benefit from membership in an organization that facilitates the growth and rewards of playing lacrosse.
- Promoting and protecting the health of participating student athletes by establishing uniform rules of play and cultivating the ideals of good sportsmanship, loyalty, and fair play.
- Working in harmony with the interscholastic governing bodies of THSLL Member School Programs, and other concerned Texas constituencies.
- Establishing and maintaining a process for continuous improvement of the League, by working with THSLL Member School Programs, and other concerned Texas constituencies.
- 5. Building school based boy's lacrosse Teams in Texas (all players on a Team attend the same source high school, ideally lacrosse is recognized as a school sport by the athletic director, and if a public high school recognized as a school sport by the independent school district.)

Division I is made up of Member School Programs that are more established lacrosse programs. DI teams have bylaws, procedures, a designated head coach and president, reasonable relations with their host school and/or city / community, and a JV and Varsity high school Teams which play a full back to back JV and Varsity schedule.

Division II is targeted at development of lacrosse programs. Division II Member School Programs generally have bylaws, procedures, a designated head coach and president, reasonable relations with their host school and/or city / community, and at least JV and Varsity high school Teams.

Division III is made up of new or relatively new lacrosse Teams, still working towards critical mass of players, coaches, funding, fields, administrative support and school / city / community support.


The Patterson Award



2014 THSLL D1 Central District



t was an exciting year in the Central District. We started the season by welcoming Vandegrift to the DI Central District and new head coaches at Austin High, Westlake, and Cedar Park. Next year the Central District D1 will continue to evolve with the addition of one to three teams as the result of the continuing growth of Lacrosse in Central Texas.

Teams continue to improve in Central District D1, and it is rapidly becoming a district that is characterized by parity. Several teams were in contention for a District playoff berth until the final day of the season. Westlake under new head coach Chris Delfausse, who left his head coaching position at Berry College to take over the helm of the Westlake high school and youth programs, won its 3rd straight Central D1 district title by completing another undefeated district schedule. Westlake has now won 28 consecutive district games.

WESTLAKE HIGH gain won the district with an undefeated district record for the 3rd consecutive year. Coach Delfausse's squad relied on a stingy defense & balanced offense to complete another undefeated district season. Westlake returns 10 Jr.s and is hoping to reload the squad from two full squads of underclassmen in its lower division programs after losing 10 seniors from this year's team.

ANDERSON HIGH made the playoffs for the 5th straight year, finishing runner up in district for the second straight season. Dealing with injuries for most of the season, the 8 seniors in the program led the way to a team best 11 wins including a 7-2 district record. Assistant Coach Stuart Shaw was recognized by the D1 & D2 head coaches as Central District's Assistant Coach of the year.

BOWIE - The Bowie Bulldogs continued their improvement in 2014 finishing as the district's 3rd seed and qualified for the D1 Super Regional for the second consecutive year with a 6-3 district record. Bowie returns 26 players to their program next year and will welcome a new group of talented freshman from a rapidly improving youth program to help replace the 10 graduating seniors. Bowie looks expectantly toward 2015 and hopes to compete again for district honors in 2015.

AUSTIN - In 2014 Austin High handed the reins of the program to longtime head JV coach John Trevey. Austin High started the season slowly with a young roster comprised of only 11 upper classman. The Maroons young squad began the season slowly, but improved with experience and hard work as the season progressed. The Austin team started district play 1-2 but were able to finish the district with a 5-4 record and a berth in the Austin Super Regional. Austin will return 12 varsity players next year that will form the foundation for a program that they believe will continue to improve in the 2015 season.

CEDAR PARK - Lead by new head coach, Tom O'Grady and a roster that included 12 seniors and 6 Jr.s, the Cedar Park Timberwolves looked excitedly towards the opening of the 2014 season. The team experienced early season growing pains, but rallied to win 4 straight district games. The late season push propelled the Timberwolves to a 5-4 district record and a return to the Central District playoffs. The vastly improved squad earned new head Coach Tom O'Grady honors as the Central District Coach of the Year. The Cedar Park squad is hoping the momentum from the late season surge in 2014 will carry forward to the 2015 season and land the squad a potential berth in a 2015 Super Regional.

VANDEGRIFT transitioned very well from their D2 central title and state semifinal performance last year after moving to D1 in 2014. The team was able to finish the season 9-7 and make the district playoffs their first year in D1. The future continues to look bright for Vandegrift who return 18 varsity players as well as three key returning starters, sophomore's Blake Tyndall, John O'Grady and Reed Randolph.

LAKE TRAVIS continued to improve in their second season as a D1 program. The Lake Travis Cavaliers finished their second D1 season with 3 district wins. The Cavalier JV & Varsity program rosters included 18 freshmen for the 2014 season, and are only graduating 6 seniors. The Cavaliers are hoping to leverage their rapidly expanding program and experience earned in a hard fought 2014 season into a playoff appearance in 2015.

WESTWOOD - It was another rebuilding year for the Westwood Warriors, but they entered 2014 with an improved squad and hopes for a possible berth in the Austin Super Regional. They battled in every game and fought to a 3 win district record. Coach Booth's squad will be improved again next year, and has aspirations to return to the district playoffs in 2015. The future seems bright for the Warriors

SPARTANS - The Spartans have a young group of hard working, resilient and competitive student athletes. The season began with improved numbers and high hopes for a possible district playoff berth. The first few weeks of the season were rough, injuries were sustained and the players starting learning lessons about battling through adversity. The young team started five freshman and three sophomores. The team improved exponentially as the season progressed. The defense rallied and kept many games close while frustrating opposing offenses. Though the program will graduate five seniors, the boys fought hard all year and established the foundation for a solid 2015 season.

ALAMO HEIGHTS Mules Lacrosse continues to grow and improve the quality of their play. Participation at all grades from 1st thru 12th increased dramatically during the 2013 - 2014 season. This was the 6th season for AH to have a high school varsity program and its 4th year to participate in the Division 1 Central District of the THSLL. Although this season's results were disappointing, the team looks forward to next year as many of the players on the team this year will be returning for the 2015 season.

On April 14, in the middle of the district playoff push, the entire Central District Lacrosse community was devastated by the death of a former Westlake Lacrosse player Mathew Gabriel. Mathew was an All State and all District player in the Central District & participated on several travel teams from the area during the summers. Mathew was a sophomore member of the Goucher Lacrosse team. Mathew was killed near campus as a result of injuries sustained when struck while walking across a street near the Goucher Campus. A 23 year old female was charged with hit and run and driving under the influence. MG3 brought joy to all around him and gave life to others as result of his tragic death by donating his organs to at least 5 other individuals. Mathew will never be forgotten. His sprit zest for life will always live in the lives of the lacrosse community in the Central District. Long live MG3.

WOODLANDS - The Woodlands repeated as the champions of the South District in 2014 by going undefeated in district games, winning by an average of 11.3 goals, including wins over Strake Jesuit 19-10, Episcopal Houston 19-2, St. John's 13-8, Houston Christian 16-4 and Kinkaid 13-7. The Woodlands spent plenty of time on the road this season, including three trips to play Dallas areas teams, losing a close game with Episcopal Dallas 8-10, a disappointing loss to Coppell 7-13 and a victory over Highland Park 10-7. The Highlanders also traveled to Austin in late March, defeating Westlake 10-4 and Westwood 6-5. Gaining the South District's number one seed for the Super Regionals, the Woodlands defeated Southlake Carroll on their home field 8-5 to advance to the State Championships for the first time since 2008. The Woodlands squad dominated the south All State ranks with ten overall selections, including attackman Gus Pinsoneault. Anthony Good and Adam Lowell, defensemen Kyle Glaesmann, Cameron Babin and Jordan Hayes, goalie Hayden Stanifer and midfielder Brain Welling. In addition, middies Sean McCanna and Tyler Murphy were designated as an All-American nominee for 2014 with Murphy selected as the South District Most Valuable Player.

STRAKE JESUIT - After missing the playoffs in 2013, Strake Jesuit jumped to second place in the South District, achieving a 6-2 record in district. Strake made a living by winning close games this season beating Episcopal Houston 8-7, St. John's 7-5, Memorial 8-6 and a hard fought a game over Kinkaid 6-5 to clinch second place. As the second seed representing the South District in the Super Regional playoffs, Strake faced a tough Episcopal School of Dallas team, losing to the Eagles 7-19. The Crusaders look to improve in 2015 by returning sophomore All-State middie and All-American nominee Andrew Eichelberger. Also winning All District honors for Strake Jesuit were senior defenseman Sean Rossettie and senior midfielder Zach Mullins.

KINKAID also improved this season as the third place finisher in south with a 8-4 overall record and a 5-3 district record including wins over Seven Lakes 14-4, Kingwood 12-7, Houston Christian 14-5, Episcopal Houston 7-5 and a nail biter final regular season victory over Memorial 11-10. Like the rest of the teams in the south, Kinkaid lost to Woodlands 13-7. As the third seed, Kinkaid faced rival St. John's in a district playoff game to advance to the Super Regionals, but emerged victorious 13-6. Kinkaid faced a difficult opponent in the first round of the Super Regionals, losing to perennial North power Highland Park 11-3. Kinkaid did very well with post season honors, including All State Attackman Connor Sullivan, All State defenseman Sam Chapman, All State Lucas Cooper (All American nominee) at Face Off, All-State long stick middie Robert Reinbolt (All American nominee) and All District midfielder Lovett Shaper.

KINGWOOD - The Kingwood Mustangs went 10-8 overall and 5-3 in District games, but started the season slowly by losing to South DII opponents Cy-Fair 11-13, Klein 8-9 and Magnolia 3-5. By the beginning of March however, Kingwood started stringing victories together, including wins over Langham Creek 8-6, Central District DI Bowie 10-6 and Vandegrift 15-7. In district play, Kingwood defeated Seven Lakes 11-8, Memorial 12-8, Episcopal Houston 10-5, a close game with St. John's 14-13 and Houston Christian 10-9. With the fourth seed in the district, Kingwood hosted Episcopal Houston in a district playoff game, winning

10-7 to advance to the Super Regional playoffs. In the first round of the Super Regionals, Kingwood again faced Bowie in a rematch during the regular season, winning the first round match 13-10. In the second round, Kingwood played a powerful Dallas Jesuit team and lost in lopsided fashion 20-2. Winning All-District honors for Kingwood for 2014 were attackman AJ Hepting, defenseman Keenan Smith and midfielder Dalton Sulver.

EPISCOPAL HOUSTON placed fifth in the South District, finishing 7-6 overall and 4-4 in district play. Episcopal started the season strong with impressive wins over Klein 20-1, Seven Lakes 14-6, Memorial 14-6 and St. John's 13-8. However, inconsistency marked Houston Episcopal's season with losses to Strake Jesuit 7-8, Kingwood 5-10, Kinkaid 5-7 and a blowout loss to Woodlands 2-19. Travelling to Kingwood for a district playoff game, the Knights fell to Kingwood for a second time 7-10 to end the season. EHS players did well with post season honors, including Matthew Lintner-All District Attack, Austin St. Denis and Jack Talkington-All District Defensemen, Anderson Clark-All District Face off and Zach Plemonos-All District Long Stick Middie.

ST. JOHN'S - After achieving a second place finish in 2013, St. John's suffered a setback in 2014 by dropping to a sixth place finish. St. John's season was marked with some close losses including losses to Dallas' Southlake 8-10, Strake Jesuit 5-7 and Kingwood 13-14, but also won a few close ones, beating Houston Christian 10-7, Memorial 9-6 and against rival Kinkaid 11-9. As the sixth seed, St. John's played at Kinkaid for the right to advance to the Super Regional the following weekend, but lost to the Falcons 13-6. Midfielder Carl Bernicker earned All-State honors along with goalie William Trieschman. Both players are All American nominees as well. At attack, junior Peter Cordill earned All-District honors.

HOUSTON CHRISTIAN'S typical run for playoff contention fell short this year with the Mustangs posting a 6-8 overall record and a 3-5 district record. An early season trip to the Austin area yielded mixed results with losses to Anderson 5-8, Westwood 9-10 but a victory against Austin High 7-4. Starting District play, Houston Christian lost to Kingwood 9-10, but followed up with a victory over Strake Jesuit. With some injuries to key players in mid-season, the district losses started to mount with losses to St. John's 7-10, Kinkaid 5-14, Episcopal Houston 2-13, Woodlands 4-16, but finished the season with a 11-9 win over Seven Lakes. Sophomore Attackman Brett Lehle earned All-District honors for Houston Christian.

SEVEN LAKES and Memorial struggled this season, with Seven Lakes' lone victory coming at Memorial's expense 10-9. Memorial did however on their final game force overtime with Kinkaid, but lost 10-11. Junior midfielder Johnny Galloway and sophomore midfielder Walker Crow earn All-District honors for Memorial.

Looking ahead to 2015, South Division I looks to add some teams from the South Division II ranks.

Due to the huge growth of lacrosse in Houston, programs at the youth, middle school and high school level need parents of today's player to be active and volunteer their time to improve the quality of the game in Texas for future players. 2014 THSLL D1 North District



nce again the 2014 THSLL Division I North District race came down to the final game of the season as once beaten Jesuit defeated the previously undefeated Episcopal School of Dallas 11-7 to conclude another highly competitive season, avenge their 2013 state semifinal loss and win the highly coveted position of #1 seed from the North in the State Super regional Playoff. Of the top four teams, each had at least one win over the other three teams.

DALLAS JESUIT, the 2014 THSLL Season North District DI Champion, was undefeated until its next to last game when they were defeated by the Scots of Highland Park 8 – 6. The Rangers battled back to take the title in the season finale against ESD at home, 11 – 7. Coached by Chris Surran, Jesuit once again traveled to North Carolina during Spring Break to play in the 5th Annual King of Spring Face-Off Classic where they finished with two wins over St. Anne's-Belfield of Virginia and North Carolina's Needham-Broughton. Jesuit goes to the North Super-Regional as the first seed from the North.

All-State award winners for the Rangers include: **Lee Belland** (#0 – 2014) All-State Midfield, **Tom Huber** (#14 – 2014) All-State Defense, **Drew Goethals** (#13 – 2014) All-State Goalie, and **John Priddy** (#12 – 2016) All-State LSM with Belland and Huber each returning as an All-State selection. All-District honors were presented to: **Gavin McClure** (#22 – 2015) All-District Attack and **Jason Myers** (#11 – 2014) All-District Midfield.

EPISCOPAL SCHOOL OF DALLAS (ESD), state runner-up to St. Marks in 2013, finished one game short of an undefeated regular season in 2014 with a final game loss to Jesuit finishing as the runner-up in the North District. The Eagles, coached by Pat Kennedy in his third year, once again featured a number of players committed to play Division I college lacrosse. To prepare for the tough District schedule, ESD traveled to Florida over Spring Break to attend the 3dLacrosse Spring Break Training Camp practicing during the day and scrimmaging against other national lacrosse programs at night. 2014 THSLL DII South District



he South District Division II saw some changes with some new teams making a move on the old established teams. New teams to the South DII were Emery Weiner as a JV team and the Woodlands DII as a Varsity team. Sienna Plantation moved into a Varsity spot after last year fielding just a JV program. Lamar and St. Thomas came on board after previously playing in the THSLL DI division.

In the Central District, Ft. Bend surprised many teams with a perfect DII Central District record. Led by Rusty Genson and assisted by James Simmons, Ft. Bend finished 5-0 for the first time, clinching a DII Regional playoff berth in Dallas. Taylor finished second to Ft. Bend in the South DII Central District followed by St. Thomas, Lamar, Stratford and Westside.

In the North District, Magnolia finished with a perfect DII North District record. Magnolia finished 4-0 and secured a host playoff spot in the THSLL DII Regional playoffs. Cy Fair finished a close second to Magnolia followed by Klein, Langham Creek and the Woodlands DII team.

In the South District, Clear Lake continued their success going 4-0 in the district followed up closely by Friendswood, with the only district loss to Clear Lake. Bellaire followed up third under first year head coach Will Longley. Pearland and Sienna Plantation rounded out the district's standings.

The South DII had the following playoff structure for 2014: Each division will rotate seedings 1 through 6 on a 3-year schedule, with the following limitations:

- (A) Seeds 1, 2 and 3 will be the division winners;
- (B) Seeds 4, 5 and 6 will be the 2nd place teams in the divisions;
- (C) On the rotating basis to be discussed below, seeds 1 and 6 will come from the same division (1st and 2nd place therein), seeds 2 and 5 will come from the same division (1st and 2nd place therein), and seeds 3 and 4 will come from the same divisions (1st and 2nd place therein);
- (D) In year 1 (2014), the North is seeds 1 Magnolia & 6 Cy Fair, the Central is seeds 2 Ft. Bend & 5 Taylor, and the South is seeds 3 Lake & 4 Friendswood


in year 2 (2015), the Central is seeds 1 & 6, the South is seeds 2 & 5, and the North is seeds 3 & 4 in year 3 (2016), the South is seeds 1 & 6, the North is seeds 2 & 5, and the Central is seeds 3 & 4

- (E) for purposes of the THSLL's playoffs, seeds 1, 2 and 3 will be the South's representatives to the state playoffs' Super-Regionals as seeds 1, 2 and 3, respectively and they will travel according to the THSLL's schedule; (F) the 4-seed to the THSLL's state playoff Super-Regional will be determined by the play-in playoff structure in section (G) on or before the Wednesday prior to the start of the Super-Regional each year (this season, the deadline is April 23, 2014);
- the deadline is April 23, 2014);
 (G) the 5-seed **Taylor** will host the 6-seed Cy Fair on the Thursday
 (Friday for rain-outs) of the week before the Wednesday defined in section
 (F) [this season, the first round of the play-in playoff will be held on Thursday, April 17, 2014 at a Central Division team's home site], and the winner will advance to play the 4-seed Friendswood at the 4-seed's home field on the following Tuesday (Wednesday for rain-outs), which complies

with the deadline stated in section (F) [this season, a South Division team will host the play-in playoff final on April 22, 2014];

In the play in games to the State Regional berth for the 4 seed from the South DII, Cy Fair edged Taylor 11-10 to keep their hopes alive. They moved on to play host Friendswood for the right to the 4 seed from the South earning a berth in the San Antonio regional playoff. Friendswood and Cy Fair played a tough game to earn a spot in the state playoffs. Friendswood pulled ahead and won by a score of 9-5 over Cy Fair earning a spot in the San Antonio DII regional playoffs.

Cedar Ridge has the current record of 14-5 overall (13-0 in Central District DII games) and is currently 3 - 0 in the postseason while the JV program finished with a record of 9 - 2 respectively.

Georgetown finished the regular season 10-5 and earned the third seed out of the Central District for DII Super Regionals. The Eagles field a team with only four seniors and three juniors, and are compromised of nearly all first-year Varsity players. Excited for the opportunity to play in the inaugural DII Super Regionals, Georgetown has a bright future ahead under Head Coach Scott Conrad.

LBJ Coach Zach Matthews took his team to an overall record of 3 and 11. This team showed a warriors spirit in every contest.
