



What we do with THSLL Member School Program Fees

No one document exists that explicitly calls out what THSLL Member School Programs get in return for the fees they pay to the THSLL and SWLOA. However, THSLL Member School Programs get the League, a 501c3 not for profit organization that has made possible boys high school lacrosse in the State of Texas for 24 years. That includes the organization, management, and oversight of the THSLL Season including scheduling of games, tournaments, and championships, and associated SWLOA official assignments, the oversight and management of the League and its Membership, including eligibility and code of conduct enforcement, and management of all the Federal and State Reporting requirements for a 501c3.

The 2012 THSLL Rulebook and TSLA, Inc. bylaws (available on <u>www.thsll.org</u> under the League Rules link under Site Navigation) define the totality of the Board and the League what is done on behalf of the Membership, and ultimately represents what is done with the fees. If a THSLL Member School Program representative attends the State Meeting and/or reviews the THSLL State Meeting Minutes (available on <u>www.thsll.org</u> under the Document Library link under Site Navigation) he or she will see the budget process and budget which includes the fees and reflects where the Board plans to distribute them and where it did so for the previous year, and finally see the goals and objectives for the THSLL for the upcoming THSLL Season.

Through <u>www.thsll.org</u>, and assigned usernames and passwords, we allow our THSLL Member School Program representatives to enter and submit their team information and game information, and to make modifications up to the cutoff date voted on by the Membership. For management, quality control, and audit purposes we do not allow THSLL Member School Programs to modify their game information and/or schedules online after the cutoff date, instead requiring them to contact Nancy Powers, our State Administrator, via email and telephone for changes and additions.

The THSLL is in the third year of a three-year contract, and is in partnership, with the SWLOA for League officiating and the scheduling software and scheduling process. Arbiter is the official scheduling software for SWLOA and THSLL from a game officials scheduling and assignment perspective. THSLL Member School Programs have access to Arbiter through an assigned username and password, however, the TSLL State Administrator manages all game changes within Arbiter on behalf of the League once they are submitted by the THSLL to the SWLOA at the beginning of the THSLL Season.
